Once the final design for the new Decatur office signage was approved, Metal Plant Manager, Joe Langston and his team began the production process from the drawings supplied. Smith Sign Plant Manager, Cliff Conley, and his team began working on the graphics supplied by Dwight Smith. The aluminum plates were sheared and drilled according to specifications and the mounting lugs for the sign were machined from raw aluminum stock in the machine shop at Walker. The mounting backplates for the signs were cut on the plasma table and received a coat of black paint at Walker. The aluminum sign plates were then transported to Smith for the graphic application and then returned to Walker for an electrostatic powder clear coating to protect the new signage from the elements for years to come. Finally, the Field Service team completed the installation of the new signs. Our Headquarters now has a new look and feel.
