Over the coming months, NCIA will be working on the following initiatives and projects to provide you with continued educational and networking opportunities:


- The NCIA Directory will be sent to all Agency & Corporate Members



Having a hard copy of the NCIA Directory makes searching for information on individual CI's, and for specific products or services, quick and easy. Looking for someone to provide information for a potential new operation? How about a CI that can provide a product or service for your organization? The **Products and Services** section of the NCIA Directory is the first stop in my search for information. Additionally, when traveling, it is convenient to be able to pack that hard copy—just in case I don't have access to my laptop.

For more detailed or complex searches, including information on Certified Inmate Training Programs and Soft Skills, I much prefer the electronic copy of the Directory. Having the ability to electronically search the PDF version makes finding that specialty training a breeze.

Once you have narrowed down which CI's have the information, product or service, or training programs that you are interested in, the contact information is easily found in either the printed or electronic copy. Using this process has allowed me to gather information on multiple occasions. In every instance, the CI's that I've reached out to have been easy to work with and willing to provide the information needed. My most recent use of the NCIA Directory was to look for CI's that operate both a package program and a commissary/canteen program. The first bit of information I found, was that operating both programs isn't done in very many CI's. Once I narrowed down the CI's that had the potential to provide me with answers to a series of questions on the topic, I began my outreach. Within a few days I had heard back from the majority of these organizations, compiled their responses, and provided the requested information to GCI's Executive Management Team.

Cl's looking to start up a new operation may not need to try and reinvent the wheel. In many cases, there are other Cl's who are already doing this type of work

and the NCIA Directory can help find those states, as well as provide contact information for outreach. Once contact is made, most (if not all) CIs are willing to share their start-up process, including challenges and whether or not they were able to overcome them. CIs will also discuss what they would do differently and how well the operation is doing now. Why not learn from the experience of others ... save the time and resources by utilizing the NCIA Directory and benefit from others who have gone before you.

I'd also urge CIs who do find themselves in the position of starting an operation from scratch to please note the start-up process, what worked and what didn't work, pros and cons, as well as a retrospective look at what may have been done differently in order to achieve better outcomes. This valuable knowledge might be sought after in the future from a CI leafing through the NCIA Directory looking for unique or ahead-of-the-curve operations.



The NCIA DIRECTORY: An Important Resource for Arizona Correctional Industries

Which Correctional Industries are financially stable across the country? What are best practices for implementing a new industry? Are we in-line with other CI's with regards to our compensation for incarcerated individuals? Are there any new industries that might make sense for our state? Where does our state CI rank amongst other states? Which vendors should we work with? I wish I had someone to call for advice or guidance! Well, it turns out that I do have a resource right at my fingertips that either provides the answers or can tell me who to call for guidance ... The NCIA Directory.


The NCIA Directory should be every correctional industry's greatest resource. Much more than a traditional "directory," this book contains invaluable contact and industry information to help all CI's prosper.

In Arizona, we rely on the directory to help find answers for many challenging questions. The most earmarked and highlighted sections in our directory are the **CI Best Practices, State Industry Profiles**, and the **Industry Data** section. **Gail Fenkell**, Deputy Assistant Director, oversees the owned and operated industries of Arizona Correctional Industries (ACI). Constantly looking forward to expand and develop new opportunities, she has "worn out" her directory.

"I utilize the model in the Best Practices section when I create new business plans for proposed industries. Understanding, addressing, and incorporating the different components in the plan really help build a convincing case," said Fenkell.

The **State Industry Profiles** contain a brief overview of each state's CI ... staff contact information, types of industries, as well as a financial snapshot of the organization.

We use the State Industry Profiles for a variety of reasons. We look to see if a CI has industries in common with ACI, or if they are in an industry that we might like to pursue. And then the real magic begins ... in that our shared mission and common goals create a wonderful opportunity to network and share ideas. If contemplating starting, invigorating, or sun-setting an industry, who better to reach out to than a fellow CI with experience in that area? "I've reached out to a number of Directors from other states to get advice and guidance on existing or new industry ideas and plans," said Gail Fenkell.

And it's not just at the Director level. The profile page lists employees in accounting, customer service, PIE, sales and marketing, etc. Our employees are encouraged to connect with their colleagues from other states to share best practices and collaborate on new ideas. Knowing there are other people who experience all of the same challenges we do really helps to provide those extra resources when facing the niche that Correctional Industries fills.

Tana Elliott, ACI's Customer Service Manager reported that "we sometimes receive a call from a jail or agency outside of Arizona looking to purchase a product that ACI provides. They may have found ACI through a web search ... we utilize the NCIA Directory to look up the CI in their state and give the caller the contact information. We're sure other state CI's do the same for ACI."

The **Industry Data** section aggregates all reported statistics from each CI and puts them in easy-to-read tables. These statistics are an excellent barometer for measuring up against other CIs. "We really like to look at the overall industry statistics to see where we rate – especially in areas like wage comparisons for incarcerated individuals, sales overview and distribution, and recidivism rates," remarked Brian Radecki, CEO for Arizona Correctional Industries.

Using the NCIA Directory has helped our organization in many ways. How I Utilize and Value My Copy of the NCIA DIRECTORY

FULL DISCLOSURE—three years ago when I moved into my role as Assistant Director at Washington State Correctional Industries (WACI), I found a copy of the NCIA Directory in my new office. I'd heard about the NCIA Directory and that it was a valuable tool used to gain knowledge and best practices when starting a new industry program, but I hadn't had the opportunity or necessity to view it previously. As I glanced through it, I thought, "Oh, this is cool! It's got a list of all the programs happening around the country. Look at some of the different business and training opportunities other industry programs are operating." Then it sat on the corner of my desk with other items slowly stacking on top of it.

Enter March 2020. Suddenly many of us were requested by our respective DOCs to develop and supply PPE and related supplies for prison facilities within our states. The NCIA Directory was a great tool for finding contacts with other CI programs to start collaborations on protective gown and mask designs, inquire about material availability, and ask questions about venturing into the unknown and previously prohibited production of hand sanitizer. Having the information available during our COVID response saved us from hours of program and product research because who better to learn from and share best practices with than our peers in Correctional Industries. And honestly, sometimes having an ear of a fellow peer who could empathize with the struggles of essential operations and the impacts on our industry program was just as beneficial as the lessons learned and information shared.

Contacts and programming aren't the only pieces of information found in the annual NCIA Directory. The **Industry Data** section provides valuable insight into the similarities and differences between our industry programs. WACI has used this to research everything from the wages and incentives paid to incarcerated workers to the different legislative policies and rules followed by other states.



Understanding the differences and similarities can be particularly useful prior to reaching out to other CIs regarding potential program expansion or partnerships. While we all have comparable goals and missions, the way we operate can vary drastically from state to state.

As we slowly move beyond COVID, the NCIA Directory will continue to be an extremely valuable tool for WACI as we look to expand existing program opportunities and to start research for potential new businesses and training programs. Knowing what other states are doing is a great advantage and opportunity to explore new ideas to strengthen and grow our respective businesses. I'm building a network of peers and every interaction I've had with the peers I have reached out to over the past three years has been nothing but positive. Whether it's during the frantic times of COVID and supply chain difficulties, or the digging out and moving forward phase we now find ourselves in, each interaction has been one of support and collaboration, and it all started with a quick glance at the NCIA Directory. •

For the upcoming 2023–2024 term, the Officer Transition Meeting was held on November 2–3, 2022, and over the two days there were productive discussions on the following:


- 2023–2024 Strategic Plan and Legislative Policy

Major League Baseball Hall of Fame Pitcher, Philanthropist, and Presidential Medal of Freedom Recipient

Mariano Rivera is a Panamanian American professional baseball pitcher who played 19 seasons in Major League Baseball with the New York Yankees from 1995-2013.

A thirteen-time All Star and five-time World Series champion, he is MLB's career leader in saves (652) and games finished (952). In addition to the numerous American League awards he won, he was inducted in the Baseball Hall of Fame in 2019, in his first year of eligibility, and was the first and only player to ever be elected unanimously by the Baseball Writer's Association of America (BBWAA).

Rivera is regarded as one of the most dominant relievers in major league history. Pitching with a longevity and consistency to the closer role he saved at least 25 games in 15 consecutive seasons and posted an ERA under 2.00 in 11 seasons, both of which are records. Along with his signature cut fastball pitch, Rivera was known for his precise control, smooth pitching motion, and composure on the field. In 2013, the Yankees retired his uniform number 42; he was the last major league player to wear the number full-time, following its league-wide retirement in 1997 in honor of Jackie Robinson.

A devout Christian, he has been involved in charitable causes and the religious community through the Mariano Rivera Foundation. For his philanthropy, Rivera received the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the highest civilian award in the United States, in September 2019. He and his wife, Clara, have three sons and live in New York.


Join Washington State Correctional Industries (CI) as we tour and take an inside look into operations at the Monroe Correctional Complex (MCC). The complex houses up to 2,400 adult males consisting of maximum, close, medium and minimum custody levels. The Washington State Reformatory opened in 1910, making it the second oldest operational prison in Washington state, behind the Washington State Penitentiary. Today, MCC is one large complex consisting of five separate facilities; the Washington State Reformatory Unit; the Special Offender Unit (opened 1980); the Twin Rivers Corrections Center (opened 1984 and now known as the Twin Rivers Unit); and the Minimum Security Unit (opened in 1997). The Intensive Management Unit is a security level five facility and is the newest addition to the MCC (opened 2007).

Washington State CI operations at the MCC covers roughly 210,000 square feet of manufacturing and services floor space. Programs include bulk sales, commissary, food packages, food service, laundry, and monthly property packages.

During the tour, you will have the opportunity to see one of Washington State Cl's largest commissaries serving the incarcerated population from seven facilities west of the Cascade Range.
